

Your Preoperative Appointment Information

Thank you for choosing Baylor Medical Center at Uptown for your upcoming surgery. Your physician may request that you come to Baylor Medical Center at Uptown before your surgery for pre-surgery testing. If possible, please call (214) 443-3010 to schedule a time for the visit.

Appointment Hours: 8:00 a.m. - 4:00 p.m., Monday through Friday. Closed Holidays

At your preoperative appointment you will be seen by a registered nurse who will speak with you to gather information about your medical/surgical history including allergies, current medications, and previous surgeries. The nurse will discuss with you what to expect before, during and after surgery and how to best prepare for your surgery. Preoperative lab work, X-rays, and an EKG may be ordered by your surgeon and performed during this time. Your appointment will take approximately 1 hour depending on your medical history.

Please Bring:

- Photographic proof of identification
- All Insurance cards and/or Medicare cards
- List of all medications you are currently taking including prescription medications, aspirin, Ibuprofen, supplements and herbal medications with the dosage and frequency.

- **Parking** - Patient parking is adjacent to the hospital and complimentary valet parking is available in front of the Hospital Entrance
- **Hospital Entrance** - Enter the building through the automatic sliding glass doors
- **Preoperative Appointment and Registration** - Take the elevator to the 2nd Floor Reception Area and sign in.
- **Date of Surgery Registration** - Take the elevator the the 3rd Floor Reception Area (press 3R in the Elevator)
